He went through a mockery of a trial and was unjustly condemned to death by crucifixion. He was a victim of a campaign of lies, slander and false accusations orchestrated by religious leaders. countrymen called for his crucifixion, and he was executed by the state as a criminal. While he was dying his executioners gambled for the only possessions he could say was his own, an article of clothing. When he was taken down from the cross he was placed in a borrowed tomb. Three days later he was resurrected and some 40 days later he ascended back to heaven. Today he exercises all power and authority, and he reigns over God's Kingdom from his throne in heaven. At some future point he will return.

This song emphasizes the **omnipotence** and **omniscience** of God in each verse.

From science, we understand...sorta...that two tiny cells...with LIFE in each one (one from a man and one from a woman can end up as a fully developed human being...pretty difficult to really comprehend.

And, regarding science...when something involves "life" (whether human, animal, or plant), "science" can only **describe** what happens...man cannot **explain** it. That's the point A.W. Dicus emphasizes in verse 3 of the song, "**Our God, He is Alive**"... "*Secure is life (Life!) from mortal mind, God holds the germ withing His hand. Tho' men may search, they cannot find, for God alone does understand.*"

Verse 1: There is, beyond the azure blue, a God concealed from human sight, He tinted skies with heav'nly hue and framed the worlds with His great might.

Refrain: There is a God, He is alive, in Him we live, and we survive; From dust our God created man, He is our God, the great I AM.
